About British Columbia

In Canada, education is a provincial rather than federal responsibility, and there is no national Ministry of Education. In British Columbia (BC), strong levels of government commitment combine with rigorous inspection and a transparent accreditation process to ensure high levels of quality throughout the entire education system. BC is Canada's westernmost province, and its vibrant economy, young and diverse population, close trade links with the world's major economies, and the warmest climate in Canada make it the destination of choice for international students studying in Canada. BC also ranks extremely high on international studies of liveability and student performance. Each year, over 94 000 international students from around the world choose BC for their education.

Post-Secondary Education

BC's post-secondary education system is known around the world for the incredible choice and flexibility offered to students. Our outstanding and seamless transfer system allows students to move from one institution to another without losing credit. BC's major research universities rank among the best in the world and our regionally based teaching universities rank among the best in Canada. BC's colleges and institutes also offer a diverse range of quality programs. In 2010, BC welcomed over 39 000 international students into our post-secondary system.

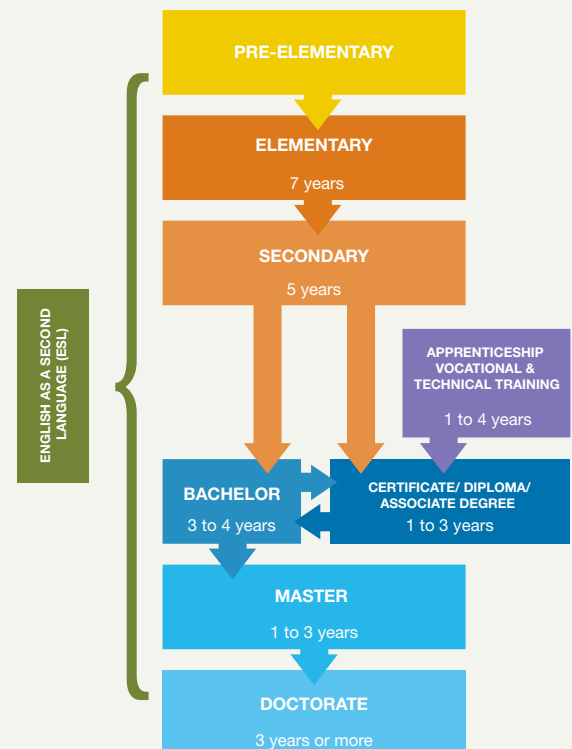
Teaching and research universities offer four-year undergraduate degrees and are located throughout the province, in both large cities and smaller regional centres. Research universities also offer a range of graduate degree programs at both the Masters and PhD levels. BC's research universities rank among the best in the Canada and perform very highly in world rankings.

Community colleges and institutes offer programs that prepare adult learners for further post-secondary studies and provide courses and programs in trades, vocational, career technical, and academic studies leading to certificates, diplomas, associate degrees and applied degrees. Many community college programs also allow students to transfer into university programs to complete an undergraduate degree. BC's seamless transfer system provides international students with many flexible options.

BC also offers international students a wide range of privately-operated career colleges. These colleges and institutions generally offer shorter-term, career-focused certificate programs in specific areas of study. In BC, career colleges and training institutions register with the province through the Private Career Training Institutions Agency (PCTIA) and may seek voluntary accreditation through the same body.

Education Quality Assurance - BC's Brand for Quality Education

Established by the province of British Columbia (BC) and administered by BCCIE, Education Quality Assurance (EQA) is BC's assured provincial brand of quality for all sectors of private and public post-secondary education.



What is BC's EQA?

EQA is a provincial quality assurance designation that identifies all BC public and private post-secondary institutions that have met or exceeded provincial government recognized quality assurance standards and offer consumer protection.

- International leader in quality assurance as the brand is accessible to all provincial post-secondary institutions, dependent on meeting eligibility requirements.
