Kwantlen Polytechnic University has an exciting opportunity for regular full-time International Educational Advisor to provide guidance and advice to international students from partner programs in China. In this role, you will provide advice and support to students in developing educational plans, achieving career and educational goals and help students to understand and ensure compliance with the requirements of their study permits as defined by the Canadian Immigration and Refugee Protection Act. This will involve conducting student interviews to assist with course selection, program planning and developing success skills as well as delivering workshops. This position will commence as soon as possible.

The ability to speak and write fluently in Mandarin is required. Superior public speaking, presentation and organizational skills are also essential. Minimum qualifications include a baccalaureate degree and two years of advising experience in a post-secondary setting. Candidates must possess a strong understanding of secondary and post-secondary educational systems including career opportunities for university graduates. They must also possess understanding of international educational systems (particularly those in China) as well as an understanding of international student and cross-cultural issues. Demonstrated analytical skills including problem solving, needs analysis and the ability to develop flexible approaches toward work procedures are essential.
