



INTERNATIONAL TUITION-BASED COMPETITION DATABASE Introduction

- The International Tuition-based Competition Database initially was created in 2012 for an Australian university.
- Now in its fourth release (2015), ITBCD covers 170 universities in 20 countries, including 20 internationally-ranked Canadian universities.
- International student tuition and fees are compared between universities for a selection of 70 popular degree programs (Bachelor's and Master's).
- International student living expenses have been estimated individually for each university, incorporating city-specific costs of goods and services and institutionally-guaranteed housing, where available.
- Using forward-looking modeling, ITBCD predicts the Total Cost of Degree Acquisition (TCODA) an international student must invest to complete a specific degree program at a given university.



INTERNATIONAL TUITION-BASED COMPETITION DATABASE ITBCD Coverage






A BC perspective: Range from just over CAD 11,000 to nearly 27,000

COST COMPETITION IN THE UNIVERSITY SECTOR2015 Annual Tuition Fees Cost: Bachelor of Economics




A Canadian perspective: Fees spread up to a factor of 4x

COST COMPETITION IN THE UNIVERSITY SECTOR Total Cost of Degree Acquisition: Bachelor of Economics




Minimum CAD 170,000 for a B.Econ. from a ranked BC university

COST COMPETITION IN THE UNIVERSITY SECTOR 2015 Annual Tuition Fees Cost: Bachelor of Economics




On an annual fees basis, BC looks reasonable in a global context

COST COMPETITION IN THE UNIVERSITY SECTOR Total Cost of Degree Acquisition: Bachelor of Economics




Cost of living makes BC universities much less competitive

COST COMPETITION IN THE UNIVERSITY SECTOR 2015 Annual Tuition Fees Cost: Master of Chemistry




Low graduate tuition fees levels impair the recruiting of talent - ...



The majority of college-type institutions price at CAD 11-16,000



Cost Competition in the International K-12 Sector


COST COMPETITION IN THE INTERNATIONAL K-12 SECTOR Upper Secondary School Tuition Fees

COST COMPETITION IN THE INTERNATIONAL K-12 SECTOR Upper Secondary School Tuition Fees at Public Schools





COST COMPETITION IN THE INTERNATIONAL K-12 SECTOR Upper Secondary School Tuition Fees at Public Schools




BC schools price in the third quartile

COST COMPETITION IN THE INTERNATIONAL K-12 SECTOR Upper Secondary School Tuition Fees at Private Schools




Private schools' fees vary notably – prep academies to parochial schools




BC private schools are costly

STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS

- Value. Fees are only one component that shapes value for a student. Competing on value thus entails taking a holistic approach to tuition fees, offsets tools (scholarships, internships, etc.), and cost of living.
- Competition. The above must take place before the backdrop of local, national, and international competitors, depending on the respective student segment.
- BC fees. BC institutions' often low(er) tuition fees levels are competitively upended by BC's high cost of living.
- Programs. Some programs remain underpriced. Yet just raising fees is not the point – higher fees require a rebalancing of the overall value proposition.
- Trends. BC has become less cost competitive over the last five years. Research and structural realignments are needed.
