


UPDATE ON THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF INTERNATIONAL **EDUCATION IN BRITISH COLUMBIA**

The International Education sector continues to grow in BC. The numbers below are from the Economic Impact of International Education report commissioned by BCCIE from Roslyn Kunin & Associates based on the number of international students in BC in 2013-14, compared with the number of international students in BC in 2009-10.

The number of international students in BC grew from 94,000 to 114,600.

International students make up a large and growing contribution to the economy of BC. Their total spending contributes over \$2.6 billion to the provincial economy.


DIRECT CONTRIBUTION IN PROVINCIAL GDP



The sum of international student spending in BC translates into \$1.86 billion in provincial GDP, a \$610 million increase compared to 2009/10.


BC'S INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION SERVICES RANKS 5TH WHEN COMPARED WITH BC'S EXPORT IN GOODS
