
UPDATE ON THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

The International Education sector continues to grow in BC. The numbers below are from the Economic Impact of International Education report commissioned by BCCIE from Roslyn Kunin & Associates based on the number of international students in BC in 2015, compared with the number of international students in BC in 2010.

The number of international students in BC grew from 90,037 to 130,053.

International students make up a large and growing contribution to the economy of BC. Their total spending contributes **more than \$3.5 billion** to the provincial economy.


DIRECT CONTRIBUTION IN PROVINCIAL GDP



The sum of international student spending in BC translates into **\$2.0 billion** in provincial GDP, a **\$800 million increase** compared to 2010.


