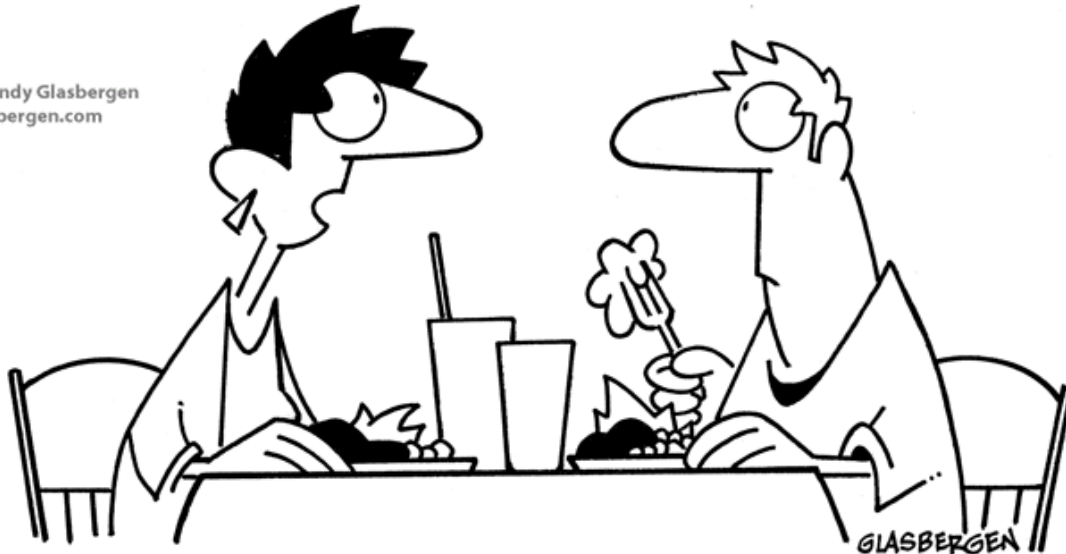

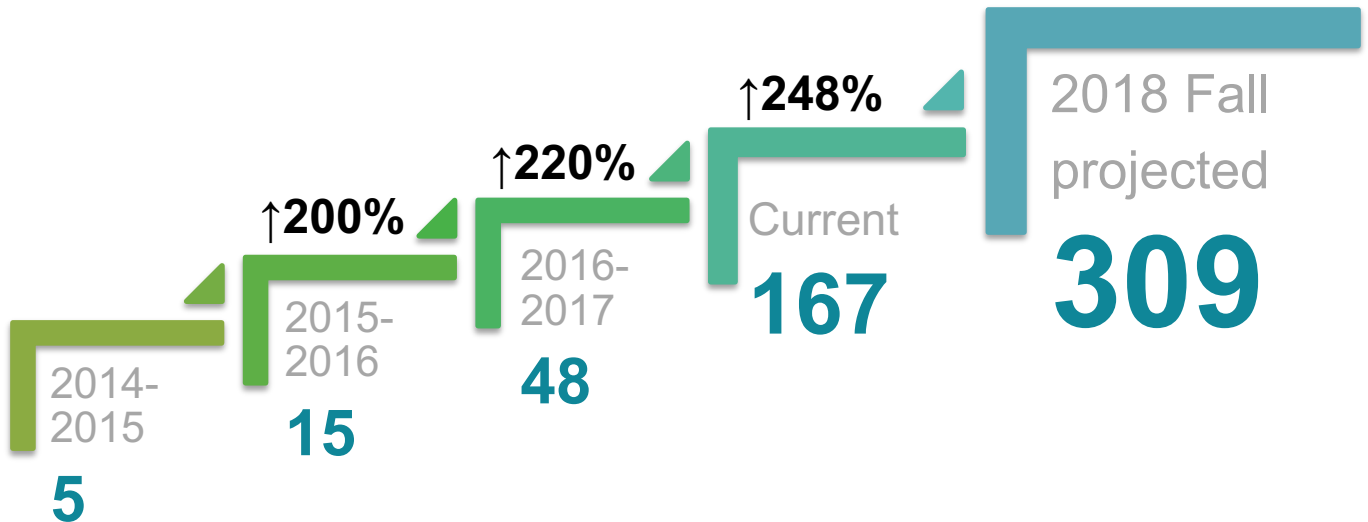

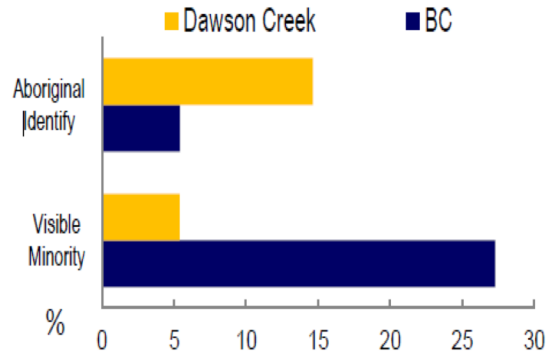
NLC International Student Growth






